NOTES

Disclosable Pecuniary Interests

The duties to register, disclose and not to participate in respect of any matter in which a member has a Disclosable Pecuniary Interest are set out in Chapter 7 of the Localism Act 2011.

Disclosable pecuniary interests are defined in the Relevant Authorities (Disclosable Pecuniary Interests) Regulations 2012 as follows –

<u>Interest</u>	<u>Prescribed description</u>
Employment, office, trade, profession or vocation	Any employment, office, trade, profession or vocation carried on for profit or gain.
Sponsorship	Any payment or provision of any other financial benefit (other than from the Council) made or provided within the previous 12 months (up to and including the date of notification of the interest) in respect of any expenses incurred by you carrying out duties as a member, or towards your election expenses. This includes any payment or financial benefit from a trade union within the meaning of the Trade Union and Labour Relations (Consolidation) Act 1992.
Contracts	Any contract which is made between you, your spouse or civil partner or person with whom you are living as a spouse or civil partner (or a body in which you or they have a beneficial interest) and the Council (a) under which goods or services are to be provided or works are to be executed; and (b) which has not been fully discharged
Land	Any beneficial interest in land which is within the Council's area. For this purpose "land" includes an easement, servitude, interest or right in or over land which does not carry with it a right for you, your spouse, civil partner or person with whom you are living as a spouse or civil partner (alone or jointly with another) to occupy the land or to receive income.
Licences	Any licence (alone or jointly with others) to occupy land in the Council's area for a month or longer.
Corporate tenancies	Any tenancy where (to your knowledge) – (a) the landlord is the Council; and (b) the tenant is a body in which you, your spouse or civil partner or a person you are living with as a spouse or civil partner has a beneficial interest
Securities	Any beneficial interest in securities of a body where – (a) that body (to your knowledge) has a place of business or land in the Council's area and (b) either – i. The total nominal value of the securities exceeds £25,000 or one hundredth of the total issued share capital of that body; or ii. If the share capital of that body is of more than one class, the total nominal value of the shares of any one class in which you, your spouse or civil partner or person with

whom you are living as a spouse or civil partner has a beneficial interest exceeds one hundredth of the total issued share capital of that class.

For this purpose, "securities" means shares, debentures, debenture stock, loan stock, bonds, units of a collective investment scheme within the meaning of the Financial Services and Markets Act 2000 and other securities of any description, other than money deposited with a building society.

NOTE: the requirements in respect of the registration and disclosure of Disclosable Pecuniary Interests and withdrawing from participating in respect of any matter where you have a Disclosable Pecuniary Interest apply to your interests and those of your spouse or civil partner or person with whom you are living as a spouse or civil partner where you are aware of their interest.

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Any recording must take place in such a way as to ensure that the view of Councillors, Officers, the Public and Press is not obstructed. The use of flash photography and/or additional lighting will not be allowed unless this has been discussed and agreed in advance of the meeting.

FOR GENERAL RELEASE

1.0 Purpose of Report

- 1.1 For members to consider an application to review an existing Premises Licence in respect of Olympus Cafe Bar, Barton Street, Gloucester, GL1 4EU.

2.0 Recommendations

- 2.1 That the Licensing Sub-Committee considers and determines the review application and takes such steps as it considers appropriate for the promotion of the Licensing Objectives.

3.0 Background

- 3.1 The Olympus Café Bar currently benefits from a Premises Licence issued under the Licensing Act 2003. A copy of the current licence can be seen attached as **Appendix 1**. The licence outlines the current licensable activities along with the current conditions.
- 3.2 Section 51 of the Licensing Act 2003 states that where a Premises Licence has effect, 'Other Persons' or a 'Responsible Authority' may apply to the relevant Licensing Authority for a review of that licence.
- 3.3 In respect of an application from a Responsible Authority, the Licensing Authority may only reject the application if the grounds are not relevant to one or more of the Licensing Objectives.

4.0 The Application

4.1 On 20th March 2018, the City Centre Improvement and Environment team received an application from Gloucestershire Constabulary to review an existing Premises Licence at Olympus Café Bar, Barton Street, Gloucester, GL1 4EU. A copy of the review application is attached as **Appendix 2**.

4.2 It can be confirmed that the review application has been served on all Responsible Authorities. In addition, the application was advertised on Gloucester City Council's website and a Public Notice of the review was displayed at the premises for a period of 28 consecutive days.

4.3 The review application states that the following Licensing Objectives have been undermined:-

- The Prevention of Crime and Disorder,
- Promotion of Public Safety, and
- Prevention of Public Nuisance.

4.4 Further supporting documentation was received from the Police on the 5th April 2018. This can be seen as **Appendix 3**.

4.5 On the 21st March 2018, an application was received to transfer the existing Premises Licence to a Mr. Armondo Gjoka.

4.6 The Police objected to the transfer application on the following grounds:-

The application to transfer the premises licence to Armondo GJOKA, we are objecting to the application as we feel that the applicant will not be able to meet the requirements of the licensing objectives. GJOKA has links to the premises dating back to 2016. He is also a business associate of the current Premises Licence Holder (Arben Ndreu) and the previous one (Avni Duka). In May 2016, GJOKA reported a burglary at the premises & called himself the business owner at that time. As the "business owner" he was involved in a disorder involving 200+ persons at the premises a couple of days prior, all documented on the burglary incident.

Eight weeks prior to the May incident there was another disorder incident at the premises in March 2016, again involving in excess of 200 people which pulled all of our City resources to the premises on Barton St.

4.7 Mr Arben Ndreu is the current Premises Licence holder and Designated Premises Supervisor and has been informed of this review.

4.8 The review application was originally due to go before the Licensing Sub Committee on 2nd May 2018.

4.9 The agent acting on behalf of Olympus Café Bar requested that the meeting be postponed to allow mediation to take place.

4.10 Following discussions with all parties involved, it was agreed by all that the meeting could be postponed so that mediation could take place.

- 4.11 A meeting was then held on 25th April 2018 to try and mediate between the Police and Matt Cloke, City Centre Improvement Officer.
- 4.12 Following the meeting, the Police emailed 18 conditions which they would require formal acceptance of for them to withdraw their review application. These conditions can be seen in Appendix 5.
- 4.13 There was further mediation of the conditions and the email chain can be seen in Appendix 6.
- 4.14 Matt Cloke emailed the applicants agent with his requirements which are as follows:-
- Within four weeks of formally agreeing to the condition, an assessment of the Olympus Café building shall be conducted by a competent person (i.e. member of the institute of Acoustics). The assessment shall feed directly into a scheme of noise attenuating measures that will be designed to minimise the noise breakout from the building, as a result of amplified sound taking place within. The scheme of measures shall be submitted to and approved in writing by the local Licensing Authority which specifies the provisions to be made for the control of noise emanating from the premises.
 - Within eight weeks of the local Licensing Authorities approval in writing the mitigation measures recommended within the above scheme shall be undertaken and implemented in full at the premises, unless otherwise agreed by the Licensing authority.
- 4.15 The applicants agent emailed on 11th May 2018 confirming that the points are accepted in principal.
- 4.16 Since the original mediation meeting on 25th April 2018 and todays Committee Meeting, no formal agreement of conditions has taken place.

5.0 Representations

- 5.1 On 28th March 2018, the Licensing Team received a representation from Matt Cloke, City Centre Improvement officer. The representation can be seen attached as **Appendix 4**.
- 5.2 None of the other Responsible Authorities responded to the review application.

6.0 Financial Implications

- 6.1 There are no direct financial implications attached to the recommendations in this report. However Members are advised that Mr. Ndreu has a right of appeal against any decision to refuse the grant of his application. At any such appeal costs may be awarded against the Council on a successful appeal if the Council has not acted reasonably.

7.0 Legal Implications

- 7.1 The Sub-Committee is obliged to determine this application with a view to promoting the four Licensing Objectives which are:-
- The Prevention of Crime and Disorder
 - Public Safety
 - The Prevention of Public Nuisance
 - The Protection of Children from harm
- 7.2 In making its decision, the Sub-Committee is also obliged to have regard to the National Guidance (Section 182, Chapter 11) and the Council's own Licensing Policy Statement.
- 7.3 The Sub-Committee must also have regard to the contents of the application and the representations made both in support of, and against, that application and give appropriate consideration to all of the evidence presented.
- 7.4 The Sub-Committee must consider whether or not it is appropriate to take further steps to promote the Licensing Objectives. If it considers that some form of action is appropriate then it may take such of the following steps as it considers necessary for the promotion of the Licensing Objectives:-
- (a) take no action;
 - (b) issue an informal warning to the licence holder and / or recommend improvement within a particular period of time;
 - (c) to modify the conditions of the Premises Licence (which includes adding new conditions or any alteration of omission of an existing condition);
 - (d) to exclude a Licensable Activity from the scope of the licence;
 - (e) to remove the Designated Premises Supervisor;
 - (f) to suspend the licence for a period not exceeding three months; or
 - (g) to revoke the licence
- 7.5 In deciding what, if any, steps to take the Sub-Committee should, so far as possible, seek to establish the cause or causes of the concerns that the representations identify and should try to ensure that any remedial action taken is directed at these causes and is no more than an appropriate and proportionate response to address the causes of concern that instigated the review.
- 7.6 Where an application for a review of a Premises Licence is decided under Section 52 of the Licensing Act 2003, an appeal may be made against that decision by:-
- (a) the applicant for the review,
 - (b) the holder of the Premises Licence.
- 7.7 These parties may appeal against the decision, to the Magistrates Court within 21 days of being notified of the decision.

7.8 The decision of the licensing authority, following the review hearing, will not have effect until the end of the period allowed for appeal or until the disposal of the appeal.

(One Legal have been consulted in the preparation this report.)

8.0 Risk & Opportunity Management Implications

8.1 There is a right of appeal to the Magistrates Court for both the applicant and the Responsible Authority. Costs may be awarded against the Council on successful appeal if the Council has not acted reasonably.

9.0 People Impact Assessment (PIA):

9.1 The Screening Stage considered risks to licence holders in the areas of gender, disability, age, ethnicity, religion, sexual orientation or community cohesion.

9.2 The PIA Screening Stage was completed and did not identify any potential or actual negative impact, therefore a full PIA was not required.

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Annex 1 – Mandatory conditions

Where licence authorises supply of alcohol

No supply of alcohol may be made under this licence

- a. at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of this licence, or
- b. at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended

Every supply of alcohol under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

Irresponsible Drinks Promotions

- 1 (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.

(2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises-

(a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to -

(i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or Supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or

(ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);

(b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective.

(c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective.

(d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.

(e) Dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability)

2. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers

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where it is reasonably available.

Age Verification Policy

(1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

(2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.

(3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either

- a) A holographic mark, or
- b) An ultraviolet feature

Below Cost Ban

A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1 -

(a) 'duty' is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979

(b) 'permitted price' is the price found by applying the formula -

$$P = D + (D \times V)$$

where -

- (i) P is the permitted price,
- (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;

(c) 'relevant person' means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence -

- (i) the holder of the premises licence,
- (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
- (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;

(d) 'relevant person' means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and

(e) 'value added tax' means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.

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The responsible person must ensure that:-

(a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures:-

1. Beer or cider - ½ pint;
2. Gin, rum, vodka or whisky - 25ml or 35ml; and
3. Still wine in a glass - 125ml; and

(b) These measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and

(c) Where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

Where licence authorises the exhibition of films

Admission of children (persons aged under 18) to the exhibition of films must be restricted in accordance with any recommendations made by the British Board of Film Classification.

Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

All conditions attached to the converted Public Entertainment Licence issued by Gloucester City Council under the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1982 are preserved as conditions attached to this licence.

The maximum occupancy of the premises shall be 426 or any such other figure as may be advised in writing by Gloucestershire Fire and Rescue Services.

Any adult orientated productions are to be performed after 19:30 hrs. The premises will adhere to Gloucester City Council Guidelines should any performance contain striptease or nudity. No under 18's will be allowed admission to such performances.

An alarm system will be installed and maintained in working order.



The police are objecting to the current licence continuing on the following grounds,

- 1) Crime and disorder.** Failure to adhere to the conditions on the licence in relation to the sale of alcohol, closing times, anti- social behaviour and criminal damage
- 2) Public Safety.** Failure to adhere to the conditions on the licence in relation to the sale of alcohol, disorder and fighting occurring inside the venue
- 3) Public Nuisance.** Failure to close premises within licenced hours, loud music being played which could be heard 100 metres away.

The premises was first built in 1922-3 as a picturedrome cinema, remodelled as the Ritz in 1955 and converted to a theatre in 1986, becoming a grade 2 listed building in October 2000. The theatre aspect has been closed for some time with no drama productions taking place, but the old bar area was granted a licence in December 2005 under the premises name of OLYMPUS CAFÉ BAR, which was renewed in 2016 but is currently suspended due to non payment of the annual fee from December 2017.

The current designated premises supervisor is Arben NDREU who has indicated he wishes to stand down but still currently remains in post.

The premises was subject to a police investigation running from April to October 2017 in relation to the cultivation and supply of cannabis. The venue was a regular meeting place for the four main principle suspects and was believed to be the centre of drugs conspiracy. This culminated in several warrants being executed in August 2017 (including one at the Olympus Café). A large quantity of cash and drugs were seized from the addresses of the four main suspects, but NONE from the OLYMPUS CAFÉ itself.

At 2350 hours on the 27th January 2018 it was reported to police that a large fight involving 30 people was occurring at the premises and on police attendance a large number of people ran from the scene, which showed clear signs of a disturbance with broken glass on the floor, broken glass in internal doors and half consumed drinks around the bar area. Enquires established that the DPS Arben Ndreu was not in the United Kingdom and that a male called Elvis Unrop had been given the keys with a view to cleaning the premises up.

A police warning letter was sent to the DPS in relation to this incident (attached).

At 0015 hours on the 10th February 2018 the City Improvements Officer Mark GROVES was walking along Barton Street some 300 metres from the premises (on duty) when he became aware of very loud music coming from the premises. He attended the premises to confirm the music was from the OLMPUS CAFÉ BAR and looked through the windows to see 50+ people in attendance and the sale by exchange of cash for alcoholic drinks taking place at the bar area along with dancing and loud music. He returned at 0135 hours and the music and dancing was still continuing at this time.

The premises currently has the licence conditions of

1. Sale of alcohol is until 2300 hours every day.
2. Opening hours of the premises is midnight everyday
3. Every supply of alcohol must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

The two breaches of being open beyond opening hours and sale of alcohol after hours on the 10th February are serious matters along with the links to named organised crime groups and its links to cannabis are all not in line with any of the licensing objectives.

The view of the Constabulary is that the premises is not being run in an appropriate manner.

A letter is attached from the Environmental Health Officer concerning the layout of the premises with regard to its noise issues to which nothing has been put in place to negate.

It is believed that a full licence revocation is required for this venue.







I am a detective constable in the Gloucestershire Constabulary.

This statement is in reference to operation Cleveland.

From April 2017 until Thursday 12th October 2017 operation Cleveland was an investigation into conspiracy to cultivate and supply cannabis and the four main principles of the operation were [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] There are also a number of other subjects of the operation who are seen as gardeners of cannabis grows within residential addresses in Gloucester, Cheltenham and Hayes.

A regular meeting place as seen by police surveillance was the Olympus café, Barton Street, Gloucester. The OCG members would meet here daily.

Numerous visitors would attend during this time, meet with members of the OCG and then depart.

On one occasion a male called [REDACTED] attended the café and a member of the OCG was then seen to exit the café and place a laden carrier bag in his vehicle. This was believed to be cannabis.

On the Thursday 24th August 2017 a warrant was conducted at [REDACTED] address in Blenheim road, Gloucester and over a kilo of cannabis was seized following a meeting with a member of the OCG. [REDACTED] has since been charged and pleaded guilty to possession with intent to supply cannabis at Gloucester crown court.

On Wednesday 11th October 2017 [REDACTED] were all arrested for conspiracy to supply and cultivate cannabis offences, along with six further males who were arrested from addresses that were being used to cultivate cannabis.

Each growing location had approx 200 plants and the estimated street value from the cannabis plants seized on the day is between £250,000 and £750,000.

On Thursday 12th October 2017 they were all charged and remanded to Bristol magistrate's court.

I am a Police Constable serving with Gloucestershire Constabulary and currently based at Bamfurlong Operations Centre on the initial response team.

On Saturday 27th January 2018 I was on duty and in company with SC 8697 UZZELL, I was in full uniform and in a marked Police vehicle. At approximately 23:55 we were deployed by the Force Control Room (FCR) to a report of a large disturbance outside the Olympus Café on Barton Street, Gloucester. On arriving at the scene a few minutes later it was clear that there were a large group of people inside the Olympus Café but there was no fighting taking place and no persons with any obvious injury.

Also in attendance were PC 781 WALLACE and PC 2266 KEAR who were working a Street Safe shift. We all entered the bar area together and I tried to speak to some of the people who were leaving the premises. Nobody would engage with me although it was apparent from the upturned chairs and glasses that were on the floor there had been some sort of disturbance. Nobody identified themselves as being the person who had called Police and nobody identified themselves as being a manager or supervisor. There was nobody behind the bar so myself and the other officers went throughout the building to try and establish who was in charge. Again, nobody identified themselves as being responsible for the building or responded to questions about what had happened inside the café.

We removed all persons from the premises and tried to ascertain who was in charge from the licence, it showed that Martin NEDVIDEK was the person listed. A female on the premises said that it was her boyfriend who was in charge but did not provide a name, she said that she was going to get her phone from the office behind the bar and call him. The female must of exited the building from the office area as she did not return and we did not locate her within the building.

A search of the building was then carried out to try and locate the keys so that the premises could be secured, during the search it became apparent that a large quantity of alcohol had been consumed and there was very little money in the till. The keys were eventually located inside a jacket that was on one of the sofas and the property was locked up. The keys were taken to Barton Street Police Station and booked into property.

Whilst at the Olympus café no person engaged with us other than the female who left without our knowledge. It was clear that some sort of disorder had taken place due to their being a number of glasses and bottles on the floor that had broken along with upturned chairs. On arrival there were a number of people leaving through the front doors and onto Barton Street, a few males appeared to have minor injuries but were not willing to engage with Police.

Later on in the evening I was made aware that a drink driver had been arrested from the rear of Mecca Bingo, I attended to assist and recognised the male as being one of the people that had been leaving the Olympus Café when Police attended. I looked into the vehicle and could see another male and two females inside. They disclosed that they had also been at the café but had left when Police arrived.







I then left the area after a few moments longer.

On the evening of the 10th February 2018 I was again on duty performing my duties as a City improvements Officer enforcing the Hackney Carriage and Private Hire fleet within Gloucester City under the provisions of the Town Police Clauses Act 1847, Local Government (Miscellaneous) Provisions Act 1976 and Local Bye Laws.

When at approximately 22:52hrs I again walked passed the Olympus Café when on this occasion the lights were on again inside there were a number of people sitting at the bar and there was a male and female member of bar staff behind the bar. I could see that the customers had drinks by them which appeared to be bottles of lager or beer and also I saw the male bar staff making himself an alcoholic drink from the optics and I saw the female get herself a Coca Cola from the fridge. On this occasion I did not see any money changing hands and there was no music playing on this occasion. The sign on the door claimed that the premise was open for business. I then left the area to carry on with my duties.

I wish to draw your attention to the following incident which occurred on the 27th January 2018. Police attended a report of a large fight at your premises at 2350 hours with clear signs of a disturbance having occurred with broken glass bottles on the floor, broken windows in an interior glass door. The bar was in disarray with half full bottles of beer and the majority of 30 persons having run out of the rear of the premises and dispersed.

After the incident I spoke to you and established you were not in the country and the person in charge Elvis UNROP was authorised to clean up the premises not to supply alcohol and in fact he was not present when the police searched the premises, when eventually located he stated he was not in charge and had been drinking beers at the premises and elsewhere . I would point out the following conditions on your license

1. Sale of alcohol is until 2300 hours every day.
2. Opening hours of the premises is until Midnight every day.
3. Every supply of alcohol must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- 4.

I believe points 1 & 3 have been breached and that point 2 would have been breached had the police not attended.

I would also remind you of your obligations under the licensing act 2003

1. The Prevention of crime and disorder
2. The prevention of public nuisance

Again I do not feel you have met these obligations based on the above.

I wish you to note that the breaches are now formally recorded on police systems and a copy of the same has been submitted to the Council licensing authority.

This letter therefore is a written warning and affirms the seriousness with which the Constabulary views the breaches to your licence in the hope that you will address the issues in a more responsible fashion. Any further issues will result in a formal review process being under taken with a view to removing the premises licence completely .

Hi both,

Thanks for the below. I have already submitted to Gloucester City Council my representation against GJOKA being the Premises Licence Holder at the Café Bar. Separately there is a Premises Licence review in progress with a hearing provisionally arranged for the 2nd May.

I have attached some info on the premises which may be of interest to you which is mostly historical & I have placed it in chronological order.

Until May 2015 the owner of the building & Premises Licence Holder & DPS was Saqib RASUL URN266215
In May 2015 Avni DUKA URN 1478167 applied to become the DPS but the Premises Licence Holder remained as RASUL who has always retained ownership of the building.

In February 2016 Duka had the licence transferred into his name so was now both Premises Licence Holder & DPS whilst ownership of the building was still retained by RASUL. (Attachment 1)

In March 2016 DUKA applied to vary the hours of the premises & changed the name to Olympus Café Bar. (Attachment 2)

In November 2016 Arben NDREU applied to become the Premises Licence Holder & DPS. (Attachment 3)

So we have a period of time between May 2015 and November 2016 where DUKA was in control of the business. I also attach a copy of an incident dated 24th May 2016 which reports a significant break to the premises which was during this time where DUKA was running the business. The complainant, is Armondo GKOKA who is also registered as the victim & he refers to himself as the business owner on the incident. Though GJOKA is not on UNIFI as an associate of DUKA this does show that he is an associate.

The premises has been very troublesome with various people all linked to each other who have tried to run it as a business. There are numerous incidents of disorder involving large groups of people sometimes in excess of 200.



Weights and Measures

3. Still wine in a glass - 125ml; and

(b) These measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and

(c) Where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

Where licence authorises the exhibition of films

Admission of children (persons aged under 18) to the exhibition of films must be restricted in accordance with any recommendations made by the British Board of Film Classification.

Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

All conditions attached to the converted Public Entertainment Licence issued by Gloucester City Council under the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1982 are preserved as conditions attached to this licence.

The maximum occupancy of the premises shall be 426 or any such other figure as may be advised in writing by Gloucestershire Fire and Rescue Services.

Any adult orientated productions are to be performed after 19:30 hrs. The premises will adhere to Gloucester City Council Guidelines should any performance contain striptease or nudity. No under 18's will be allowed admission to such performances.

An alarm system will be installed and maintained in working order.

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

I make this representation in regards to the application received from Gloucestershire Constabulary to review the Premises Licence at Olympus Café Bar, Barton Street, Gloucester and would advise as follows:

Directly opposite the Olympus Cafe are numerous residential flats that are approximately 10 metres from the full glass front facade and entrance doors of the premises. Furthermore, immediately to the rear of the premises lies Blenheim Road and Vauxhall Road. There are a considerable number of sensitive receptors within a distance of approximately 150m of the Olympus Café that have been and are likely to be adversely affected by regulated entertainment taking place within the premises.

The Olympus Café has been the cause of concern to the Environmental Protection Team of the City Council since approx. 2015. In March of 2016 a premises licence variation was submitted to the Licensing Team to request an extension of licensable activities on a Friday/Saturday night until 03:00 hours. As a result of complaints of Statutory Noise Nuisance arising from amplified sound emanating from within the premises it was agreed however that the applicant would except a termination point of 01:00 hours in regards to this application. I understand the Licensing sub-committee upon hearing this variation further reduced the hours of licensable activities on a Friday/Saturday night until 00:00 hours so as to ensure the premises operated within the four licensing objectives, specifically Prevention of Public Nuisance.

In April 2016 (during a temporary event) as a result of an Albanian party taking place within the premises an officer of the Council witnessed the likely occurrence of a Statutory Nuisance resulting from amplified sound emanating from within the premises. It was noted in the witness statement provided by the officer that the amplified sound emanating from within the Olympus Café could be clearly heard approximately 50 metres away where the officer was stationary outside the Beacon of Light, 177 Barton Street. This incident resulted in the service of an Abatement Notice, under the provision of the Environmental Protection Act 1990, upon the Premises Licence holder (PLH) which clearly stated the nuisance must be abated with immediate effect.

Further, site meetings took place with the PLH in March/April 2016 to identify methods of improving the acoustic qualities of the premises so as to prevent future incidents of public nuisance. Several recommendations so as to improve the attenuation of the building fabric were identified at this time, in which the PLH was made aware of as it was my opinion the premises was not fit for the purpose it was intended for.

On the 6 September 2016 I was informed, by the Licensing Team, of a late TEN application in respect to this premises and also informed that the Premises Licence had been transferred to a Mr Arben Ndreu. In regards to this application I spoke to Mr. Ndreu on 7th September 2016 to discuss if any of the proposed mitigation measures recommended to the previous PLH during the meeting in March 2016 had been installed in the premises, so as to restrict the complaints of public nuisance that have been linked to regulated entertainment taking place within the premises.

Mr. Ndreu confirmed that an internal lobby had been built around the front door to prevent the escape of noise when the door is opened, however no other proposed mitigation measures had been introduced to prevent the escape of amplified sound from within the premises. As a result it was advised that all future TEN applications submitted to this authority would likely be refused on grounds of prevention of public nuisance until such time that mitigation measures have been introduced to reduce the impact of regulated entertainment on localised sensitive receptors.

Mr Ndreu then opened lines of communication with the Environmental Protection Team to discuss the above meeting and recommendations made in respect to improving the acoustic qualities of the premises. Further works were undertaken by Mr Ndreu that improved the acoustic qualities of the building fabric. Additionally Mr Ndreu agreed with an officer of the Council that only a specifically identified PA system would be used, in addition to agreeing a maximum noise level being emitted from the premises.

As a result of the above agreement being in place and the physical improvements being made to the building fabric it was agreed that no further objection to TEN applications would be made by the Environmental Protection Team unless or until further complaints were received.

On the 10th February 2018 and as a result of a private party within the Olympus Cafe an officer of this Authority witnessed a statutory nuisance at Olympus Café, 162-170 Barton Street, Gloucester, GL1 4EU arising from loud amplified sound emanating from within.

This incident was witnessed on two separate occasions on the 10th February 2018 at 00:15hrs and again at 01:35hrs whilst the City Council Officer was on duty in the area. It is noted in the witness statement provided by the officer that the amplified sound emanating from within the premises could be clearly heard approximately 91 metres away when the officer was in the area of Gothic Cottages, Barton Street. Due to the time that had elapsed since April 2016 and as a result of the Premises Licence being transferred to Mr Ndreu an Abatement Notice under the above Act was issued upon Mr Ndreu as the PLH, which again clearly stated the nuisance must be abated with immediate effect.

I understand after further discussions with Mr Ndreu, since the enforcement notice was issued, that the Olympus Café has remained closed as he no longer wishes to retain any responsibility to the premises, I have also been made aware that Mr Ndreu wishes to transfer the Premises Licence to an individual known to be his cousin, Mr Armondo Gjoka.

With the above borne in mind it is still my opinion that the Olympus Café is not fit for the purpose it is proposed to be used for i.e. live bands/recorded amplified sound, as such I strongly recommend that the Licensing Authority fully revoke the Olympus Café Premises Licence on grounds of prevention of public nuisance.

Please suggest suitable conditions that the committee could add to the licence (if granted) to remedy your concerns or if agreed in advance of a hearing by the applicant would allow you to withdraw your representation or enter details of any other matters, not commented on elsewhere relating to your representation that you would like the committee to take into account. (Please continue on a separate sheet if necessary).

Should the Licensing Authority choose to disregard the above recommendation I would ask that additional restrictive conditions be imposed upon any reviewed premise licence that further restricts the use of live/recorded amplified sound within the premises. The conditions are outlined below;

- Noise from music and associated sources shall not be audible in noise sensitive premises at any time.
- Automatic door closers shall be fitted and installed to all external and internal sound trap lobby doors within the premises to the satisfaction of the Licensing Authority by the 14th June 2018
- A noise limiting device shall be used in relation to all sound amplification equipment used in conjunction with the Premises Licence.
 - The noise limiting device shall be installed and set at a level approved by the Council through its authorised environmental health officer prior to the opening of the premises in conjunction with the premises licence.
 - The noise limiting device shall be properly secured so that it cannot be tampered with.
 - The noise limiting device shall only be reset with the authority of the Council through an authorised environmental health officer
 - If deemed necessary, the noise limiting device shall be reset to a level approved by the Council through an authorised environmental health officer within 14 days of notification.
- The premises licence holder shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that patrons using any outside areas (such as terraces, beer gardens and smoking areas) do so in a quiet and orderly fashion.
- Clear notices displayed at all points where customers leave the building must instruct them to respect the needs of local residents and leave the premises and the area quietly.
- The premises supervisor, manager or other competent person shall manage any outdoor area to ensure that customers do not behave in a noisy, rowdy or offensive manner.
- Clear notices must be displayed at prominent points in all outdoor areas requesting that they respect the needs of local residents and behave in a quiet and orderly manner.

1. A CCTV system shall be installed which will cover all areas of the premises. The CCTV system shall be maintained in good working condition. It will be recording 24 hours every day. Recordings are to be retained for a minimum of 28 days and are to be made available within 48 hours to the Police, Trading Standard or Council officers upon request and be of evidential quality.
2. The CCTV system is required to be a local system with the hard drive being within the premises (i.e. not a remote system)
3. Staff working at the premises will be trained in the use of the equipment and a log will be kept to verify this.
4. Cameras on the entrances must capture full frame shots of the heads and shoulders of ALL people entering the premises & the shots must be suitable for ID purposes.
5. Should the CCTV become non-functional this will be reported immediately to the Licensing Authority.
6. SIA trained door staff are to be employed at the premises every Friday, Saturday & Bank Holiday Sunday evenings from 8pm until closing time. They are to be kept on until every customer has left to ensure quiet & trouble free dispersal. The ratio of door staff required will be 1:100 with a minimum of 2.
7. The licensee to adopt a "Challenge 25" policy where all customers who appear to be under the age of 25 and attempt to purchase alcohol or other age-restricted products are asked for proof of their age. The licensee should prominently display notices advising customers of the "Challenge 25" policy. The following proofs of age are the only ones to be accepted: • Proof of age cards bearing the "Pass" hologram symbol • UK Photo Driving licence • Passport.
8. The licensee to keep a written record of all staff authorised to sell alcohol, the record to contain the full name, home address, date of birth and national insurance number of each person so authorised. The staff record to be kept on the licensed premises and made available for inspection by the Licensing Officer, Trading Standards or the Police.
9. The licensee to ensure that each member of staff authorised to sell alcohol has received adequate training on the legislation with regard to age restricted products and that this has been properly documented and training records kept. The training record is to be kept on the licensed premises and made available for inspection by the Licensing Officer, Trading Standards or the Police.
10. The licensee to ensure that each member of staff authorised to sell alcohol is fully aware of their responsibilities in relation to verifying a customer's age and is able to effectively question purchasers and check evidence of proof of age.
11. The licensee to ensure that each member of staff authorised to sell alcohol is sufficiently capable and confident to confront and challenge under 18's attempting to purchase alcohol.
12. The licensee to keep a register of refused sales of all age- restricted products (Refusals Book).
13. The DPS shall be on the premises at all times that it is engaging in licensing activities ie sale of alcohol.

14. The occupancy shall be restricted to XXXX persons in the premises including performers and staff. The Premises Licence Holder shall ensure that there are appropriate management controls to ensure that the occupancy figure is not exceeded at any time. Appropriate controls shall be put in place to ensure that the occupancy of the premises / specified areas are not exceeded at any time.

15. The premises licence holder shall ensure that documented security arrangements are implemented at the premises to discourage the sale and consumption of controlled substances. Security arrangements shall include having a member of staff regularly check toilet areas, the date and times of all checks to be recorded in a book kept for that purpose and to be produced upon request to Police, Trading Standards or Council officials. Signage shall also be placed in the toilet areas advising patrons that checks are conducted regularly.

17. Each event shall be risk assessed with a view to employing additional SIA trained security staff. If they are required it will be at the ratio of 1:100 with a minimum of 2 staff.

OFFICIAL

1. A CCTV system shall be installed which will cover all areas of the premises. The CCTV system shall be maintained in good working condition. It will be recording 24 hours every day. Recordings are to be retained for a minimum of 28 days and are to be made available within 48 hours to the Police, Trading Standard or Council officers upon request and be of evidential quality.
2. The CCTV system is required to be a local system with the hard drive being within the premises (i.e. not a remote system)
3. Staff working at the premises will be trained in the use of the equipment and a log will be kept to verify this. (Agree change to DPS but it would be good to have someone else trained)
4. Cameras on the entrances must capture full frame shots of the heads and shoulders of ALL people entering the premises & the shots must be suitable for ID purposes.
5. Should the CCTV become non-functional this will be reported immediately to the Licensing Authority.
6. SIA trained door staff are to be employed at the premises every Friday, Saturday & Bank Holiday Sunday evenings from 8pm until closing time. They are to be kept on until every customer has left to ensure quiet & trouble free

dispersal. The ratio of door staff required will be 1:100 with a minimum of 2. (would this sit better if we said only applicable if more than 100 patrons are present)

7. The licensee to adopt a "Challenge 25" policy where all customers who appear to be under the age of 25 and attempt to purchase alcohol or other age-restricted products are asked for proof of their age. The licensee should prominently display notices advising customers of the "Challenge 25" policy. The following proofs of age are the only ones to be accepted: • Proof of age cards bearing the "Pass" hologram symbol • UK Photo Driving licence • Passport.

8. The licensee to keep a written record of all staff authorised to sell alcohol, the record to contain the full name, home address, date of birth and national insurance number of each person so authorised. The staff record to be kept on the licensed premises and made available for inspection by the Licensing Officer, Trading Standards or the Police....(ask)

9. The licensee to ensure that each member of staff authorised to sell alcohol has received adequate training on the legislation with regard to age restricted products and that this has been properly documented and training records kept. The training record is to be kept on the licensed premises and made available for inspection by the Licensing Officer, Trading Standards or the Police.

10. The licensee to ensure that each member of staff authorised to sell alcohol is fully aware of their responsibilities in relation to verifying a customer's age and is able to effectively question purchasers and check evidence of proof of age.(covered by 9 so delete)

11. The licensee to ensure that each member of staff authorised to sell alcohol is sufficiently capable and confident to confront and challenge under 18's attempting to purchase alcohol.

12. The licensee to keep a register of refused sales of all age- restricted products (Refusals Book).

13. The DPS shall be on the premises at all times that it is engaging in licensing activities ie sale of alcohol.

14. The occupancy shall be restricted to XXXX persons in the premises including performers and staff. The Premises Licence Holder shall ensure that there are appropriate management controls to ensure that the occupancy figure is not exceeded at any time. Appropriate controls shall be put in place to ensure that the occupancy of the premises / specified areas are not exceeded at any time.

15. The premises licence holder shall ensure that documented security arrangements are implemented at the premises to discourage the sale and consumption of controlled substances. Security arrangements shall include having a member of staff regularly check toilet areas, the date and times of all checks to be recorded in a book kept for that purpose and to be produced upon request to Police, Trading Standards or Council officials. Signage shall also be placed in the toilet areas advising patrons that checks are conducted regularly.

16. A minimum of 28 days' notice shall be given to Police for all events and a Promotion Risk Assessment form shall be completed & submitted to Police Licensing.

17. Each event shall be risk assessed with a view to employing additional SIA trained security staff. If they are required it will be at the ratio of 1:100 with a minimum of 2 staff.(can be deleted as covered by 16)

18. All glassware used at the venue is to be safety glass or polycarbonate.

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
