I am writing to strongly oppose a 24 hour licence to be granted for 36a Bishopstone Road Gloucester. I understand that the Licence is to cover a 24 hour delivery service of alcohol and not to be sold in person from the premise. However I feel the certain points should be taken into consideration.

Public nuisance.

This is a quiet cul de sac location and not an industrial area. I feel having delivery vehicles traveling up and down the road 24 hours a day will cause a public nuisance and cause disruption to my childrens sleep, We have a new born baby, a 7 year old and a 9 year old in our home. Also at times Parking is a problem in the road and I believe the extra traffic to a business premise will only add to this problem. Also there is an old persons home in the direct vicinity of the said premise.

Crime and Disorder.

I believe that if this licence is granted it will increase the possibility of burglary in the area with a premise that is storing alcohol being a prime target and attract thieves and burglars to the area.

Public Safety and protecting MY children from harm.

As said before this is a quiet cul de sac location where at times my children are walking, playing and getting in and out of the family car. If the licence is granted it will cause more traffic from delivery vans and trucks and pose a direct danger to my children. 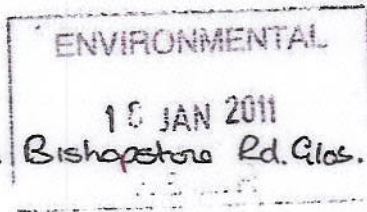

If such a facility is offered in 36a bishopstone road. People will definitely hang around in that field and they can ask to get a delivery in that area. Slowly it will become a hub for the interested parties, who can get a delivery there because there is no definition for vicinity or area and will have great negative impact

for the residents and you can imagine what all things that will follow such a situation.

The anti social element will surely surge and my family and the residents in this area have to carry the risk. Not only that it can lead to vandalism, prostitution, drug deals so and so by granting this kind of licence in this premise you can help us have all this associated risk.

of youths coming and going with girls and having noise althrough the night loudly and kids cannot sleep especially the small one and the other one has to go to school in the morning as well. I have tried to tell them they don't even come out to listen what I have to tell them.

If those people want to make business why it should be from residence, It could be done from commercial outlet that can be rented cheaply and will have the freedom and space.

Dear Sirs,

I would firstly apologise for the lateness of this email - I have been suffering from a virus infection and high temperature, and am still unwell.

I wish to make representation to the Licensing and Enforcement Office strongly objecting to the granting of a license seeking permission for the sale of alcohol from 36A Bishopstone Road, Gloucester, GL1 4BZ. I do so on the grounds that I live in the vicinity of these premises, often in fact having to park my car outside the said premises when no other space is available. With only on road parking available in this street there is very little space, especially weekends and evenings. This alone would seem grounds for objection to a business based at these premises where there is an intention to carry on a home delivery service which must involve vehicles (in addition to those belonging to residents in the street.)

I am also extremely concerned at the granting of a license in the vicinity in which I live as this street is specifically residential, houses are built in close proximity to each other and house predominantly families, many with young children, indeed the newer houses at the end of the street are predominantly family homes, with a contrast of housing specifically for elderly/disabled people in the new stretch. The granting of a license to sell alcohol is not in the least conducive to this scenario, indeed additional traffic alone would constitute an additional hazard for both children and elderly people as well as users of motorized wheelchairs.

I also submit that the incentive for burglary of such premises and the surrounding area would be greatly increased once it was known that alcohol is stored.

I feel strongly that all four of the licensing objectives would be breached if granting of such a license were to go ahead. Bishopstone Road is a residential, respectable and quiet area, businesses which are of a home delivery nature, especially one which sells alcohol are most definitely not suitable for such an area. Surely this type of business should be run from a business/trade park not a traditional residential road such as ours?
