1. Music and amplified voices emanating from the premises shall not be audible at the nearest noise sensitive premises, to be agreed by an officer of Environmental Protection;
2. All windows and fire exit doors shall be kept closed when amplified sound (including television) is being produced within the premises other than for the purpose of access and egress;
3. No person shall leave the premises by the rear entrance/exit after 21:00hrs except in emergency.
4. No rubbish, including bottles shall be moved, removed or placed in outside areas between the hours of 21:00hrs and 08:00hrs;
5. Patrons shall be restricted from smoking at all times at the front of the premises and smoking shall only be permitted within the smoking shelter at the rear of the premises.
6. All persons leaving the premises shall ushered by SIA approved security to disperse from the area immediately after exiting.
7. Signs shall be posted inside the building at all exits reminding customers to leave quietly and respect the needs of neighbours

This representation is submitted on behalf of the Chief Constable of the Gloucestershire Constabulary and as an objection to an extension of trading hours for the Olympus Café Bar. The extension relates to the sale of alcohol from 2300hours daily to 0300hours Friday and Saturday. In respect of other licensable activities the extension is from Midnight daily to 0300hours Friday and Saturday.

- It is submitted that extending licensable hours of this Café Bar would be *extremely likely* to result in additional Crime & Disorder occurring during the hours of Midnight and closure and in the area. The larger concern being problems around dispersal
- It would also be to the detriment of anyone living in the vicinity as an extension to 0300hours is likely to result in an increase in disturbance from anti-social behaviour and disorder in surrounding streets over a longer period and at a later time than currently experienced.

Levels of Crime and Disorder and public nuisance are increasing across the city at present and are particularly high in this area, located just outside an area of special policy. Anti-social behaviour is particularly evident during the early hours of Saturday and Sunday mornings.

The Constabulary have attended various disturbances both in the street and to the rear of the Olympus bar during the early hours

Extending the licence to 3am will expand the core area of concern for the Police thus depleting resources already focused on the area of special policy during key night time economy hours.

The police have had discussions with Mr Duka prior to the application and the following was suggested.

In relation to Café Bar

CCTV will operate throughout the premise of a standard satisfactory to the police and licencing authority and shall monitor all areas used by patrons including the outside and designated smoking areas . All CCTV equipment shall be maintained in good working order and shall continually record during licensable hours and for a minimum of 2 hours afterwards. CCTV shall be retained for a minimum of 31 days (14 days if digital system) and made available to an authorised officer of police or licensing authority upon request. During times of opening there should be a member of staff technically able to operate the cctv system and provide images on request.

A minimum of 5 SIA registered door staff will be employed at the premises from 2200hours until 30 minutes after close when live music is taking place or where specific events are taking place.

Where no live music or event door staff will be provided at a ratio of 1:100 subject to a minimum of 2 on Friday and Saturday evenings after 2200hours. A risk assessment will be made for other evenings

Police will be notified of specific events a minimum of 10days prior to the event and a risk assessment form completed and supplied to police.

Closure of premises at 2am, Sale of alcohol to conclude at 0100hours, live.recorded music 0130.(although I appreciate Mr Duka has agreed to 0100hours close).

For a period of 30minutes following closure 2 SIA staff will be employed at the front of the premises and 2 at the rear in high visibility clothing to ensure safe, orderly and quiet dispersal of customers.

That the premise be an active member of city safe as long as city safe operates.

In relation to Theatre where Bar is not used.

As CCTV above (This may include 1 or 2 extra cameras to cover theatre)

A contract to be signed by hirer.

Contract will ensure provision of SIA doormen at a ratio of 1:100 subject to a minimum of 2 where live music after 2200hours. Risk assessment to be completed in relation to doormen for other events.

Police to be notified a minimum of 10days in advance where live /recorded music after 2200hours or when there are specific events taking place concluding after 2200hours.

In relation to Theatre when Bar is used(complete premises)
