To whom it concerns,

I am writing to appeal against the decision made regarding my new vehicle's private licence plate application.

When I went to purchase this vehicle on the 26th June 2016, unfortunately the garage in Leicester (V12 motors) where I purchased the car from did not have the log book. As the car is a 2011 plate I incorrectly assumed it would be satisfactory under the city council's 5 year criteria. and made a mistake by not checking the registration date.

I have part exchanged my Mercedes C class for this newer vehicle and paid additional monies on top for this Peugeot 3008 as this vehicle is much more spacious and comfortable - ideal for customers/clients, especially on longer journeys.

The garage called me on the 18th of July to say that the log book had arrived and that the vehicle was now ready for collection. When I went to pick up the car I had to wait 2 hours as they couldn't locate the log book. By the time they found it I just wanted to get going as it was now 21:00.

After registering my documents at the council on 19/07/2016, I received a phonecall from yourselves on 21/07/2016 that the car is actually more than 5 years old - by only 3 months.

I can honestly say this was a genuine mistake and oversight on my part. I am not in a position financially to part exchange this car again as I will end up losing over £1,500.
