

Dear Rebecca,

Application for a Street Trading Consent for a mobile hot food van in Glevum Way.

The Abbeydale Community Association Board of Trustees, has discussed this matter and is firmly opposed to the application.

ACCESS

1. There is already considerable congestion on Glevum Way caused by parking and individuals selling second-hand cars.
2. The additional congestion and pedestrian activity associated with a hot food van would be a significant road safety issue with potentially harmful consequences for pedestrians and drivers.
3. A hot food van would further restrict safe access to the community centre, the car park and Glevum Way park for residents.

LITTER

4. A previous hot food van, situated in the Ridge and Furrow car park, led to considerable mess from litter by way of discarded wrapping, packaging and unwanted elements of food purchases. Our view is that a hot food van on Glevum Way, will cause a similar mess.

LOCATION

5. Glevum Way is not a through route. A hot food van positioned here would not attract passing trade but rather draw a late night crowd to an area which is normally quiet.
6. We fear the centre outside seating areas would be used and the majority of mess left on the centre site.
7. There are no public toilets or hand washing facilities available to the hot food van staff and customers between 4pm to 11pm.
8. It is our view that the community centre would be vulnerable to incursion, particularly at a time when staff are closing up at 11pm.
9. We would also question the wisdom of positioning a hot food van outside an NHS surgery dealing in part with the results of fast food eating as described in the application.

Dear Rebecca

Thank you for advising us of the above application and giving us the opportunity to comment. We **strongly** object to the application for the following reasons:

- The planned location is on a busy road and a mobile food van would cause a significant increased hazard to pedestrians crossing the road.
- It would be inappropriate to site a van selling fast food opposite a Medical Practice that is trying to promote healthy eating.
- A mobile food van was previously sited in the former Ridge and Furrow public house car park despite our objections at the time. This led to a significant increase in litter including kebab wrappers and empty soft drink cans being left at the entrance to the Practice. The unpleasant smell of frying food also led to us having to work with windows closed, which during warm weather was clearly unacceptable.

I would be grateful if the above comments could be taken into consideration when a decision is made on the application.

So turning specifically to this application.
