I am writing to inform you of my objection to the above alcohol licence application in its current form for the following reasons:-

- I have had many local constituents contact me extremely concerned about the licence application to start serving alcohol from 6am to 11pm on a daily basis. I fully understand and share the strength of concerns raised by both local residents and local schools regarding the above application.
- The shop is located in a highly densely populated residential area. As everyone knows, Barton & Tredworth is the most densely populated area in all of Gloucestershire.
- There are genuine concerns for the safety and well being of residents and particularly school children using the area as there is an infant/primary school within less than 100 yards of this shop. As you will be aware, there have been a number of very serious and frightening alcohol related incidents within close proximity of this shop within the last 6-12 months.
- The potential sales of alcohol at such early hours in the morning is neither reasonable nor responsible as it could lead to further anti-social problems, violence and crime in the area, and thus have a negative and detrimental impact on the lives of the local residents, the local community and local school/school children.
