





#### Eastgate Street Drinkery - Operating Strategy

Eastgate Street, Gloucester has long been synonymous with late night licensed premises. The street is home to many late night licenced premises such as bars & night clubs as well as takeaway food outlets.

While the businesses on and around Eastgate Street may all vary in style they do all offer a very similar product / venue; late night drinking establishments. This form of "hospitality" can increase crime, disorder & public nuisances from anti-social behaviour brought on by irresponsible drink offers, poorly run admittance schemes and targeting certain demographics. All of which has deterred many local residents such as young families from visiting Eastgate Street, as well as limiting the success of other local businesses I am sure.

However, Eastgate Street is surrounded by a large residential area. The immediate area houses many young professionals, young families and visiting students. Therefore we believe that Eastgate Street has the potential to attract a broader spectrum of customers.

We hope to attract young families, workers and students to the area by providing a venue offering an alternative to the current limited variety of businesses.

Eastgate Street Drinkery shall be open from midday onwards serving freshly brewed coffee, tea and pastries along with rustic gourmet burgers and pizzas & locally brewed craft beers. Housed within a welcoming space with an urban rusticity style to it. The venue shall also provide complimentary exhibition spaces (indoor & outdoor) to promote our commitment to local creatives. In addition to this we intend to operate a weekly live music events such as the very popular "BuskOff" that we run at Six Degrees Of Separation, Cheltenham (local young musicians perform for customer votes to win cash prizes). As well as looking into hosting other regular live entertainment events such as comedy nights.

Eastgate Drinkery shall not be focussed on attracting vertical drinkers. There has been a recent shift in trend towards businesses that offer a more "food based" environment such as the venues operating within the Gloucester Docks development. We believe that Eastgate Street is the ideal location to capitalise on such a trend.

Eastgate Street is seen as an unattractive location by many. The street has been the embryotic source of much anti-social behaviour in recent years. We intend to dilute this culture and hopefully help change the focus of the area. Eastgate Street Drinkery shall

demonstrate that this area can be attractive to a wider customer base; offering a higher quality product and better variety to the local community.

We shall of course have to address the inherent problems of Eastgate Street. To this end we will adopt a very similar operating strategy already successfully in place at both Thirteen Degrees & Six Degrees Of Separation including;

- The use of SIA Door Supervisors at busy operating times; controlling the admittance
  of customers, monitoring customers behaviour while inside the venue as well as
  controlling and monitoring customers leaving the venue. We propose that we use
  SIA Door Supervisors from 8pm onwards Thurs, Fri & Sat evenings. We shall also use
  SIA Door Supervisors on any other evening justified by trade level. This shall be risk
  assessed on a continual basis.
- Customers found to be disruptive to other members of the public shall be removed
  instantly. Members of the public who appear to be a nuisance to others, drinking in
  the street or demonstrating anti-social behaviour as they approach the venue will
  not be granted entry. This includes any person(s) who seem to be under the
  influence of drugs or excess of alcohol upon approach.
- Any person found in possession of any illegal drugs upon being searched (or who
  refuses to be searched) will be refused entry or removed from the venue & banned
  permanently. Anyone found in possession of illegal drugs at any point will be
  detained for Police to attend.
- While still offering our customers attractive offers we will not adopt any
  irresponsible drinks pricing strategy that promotes the excessive consumption of
  alcohol. We propose a minimum pricing tariff to be in effect which our "offers"
  pricing does not fall below.
- Earlier opening & closing times (Midday until 1am Sun Thurs & 2am Fri & Sat).
   Notifying local authorities of any change.
- A "drinking up" period of 30mins at the end of every session; during this time no alcohol is to be served or music to be audible. This period is to allow customers to disperse gradually rather than en mass.
- Maintaining the street outside of the venue by cleaning the area at the end of every session.
- No drinking outside the front of the venue after midnight.
- Challenge 21 Challenge the age of any person whom appears to be under 21 years of age.
