Annex 1 – Mandatory conditions

All Supplies of Alcohol

Where licence authorises supply of alcohol

No supply of alcohol may be made under this licence

- a. at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of this licence, or
- b. at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended

Every supply of alcohol under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

Age Verification Policy

- (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
- (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
 - (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either –
 - a) A holographic mark, or
 - b) An ultraviolet feature

Below Cost Ban

A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1 -

- (a) 'duty' is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979
- (b) 'permitted price' is the price found by applying the formula -

$$P \text{ equals } D + (D \times V)$$

where -

- (i) P is the permitted price,
 - (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
 - (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) 'relevant person' means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence -
- (i) the holder of the premises licence,
 - (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) 'relevant person' means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent

the supply in question; and

(e) 'value added tax' means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994

Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by the sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.

Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.

The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

- 1 All staff to undergo training in Licensing and social responsibility in sale of alcohol.
- 2 The shop is to have a policy of no irresponsible alcohol promotions.
- 3 The shop management is to work closely with the local Police to reduce any crime and disorder.
- 4 The premises is to have a 'No sale to drunken people' policy.
- 5 To work closely with local community and Police to identify anyone causing anti-social behaviour to be barred from the shop or no access to alcohol from the shop.
- 6 CCTV is recording at all times that the shop is open, that it will store data for a minimum of 14 days and that there will always be someone available to upload images to disc or memory stick upon request by Police, Council or Trading Standards. The CCTV should be of a good standard and well maintained.
- 7 No beer/lager and cider over 7.4% abv is to be sold by retail on the premises.
- 8 Challenge 25 system to be adopted with refusals book kept and available to Police and Council Officers on request.
