# **Article 8 – Regulatory and Other Committees**

## 8.01 Regulatory and Other Committees

The Council shall appoint the quasi judicial Committees set out below to discharge the functions described in Part 3 of this Constitution.

### 1. Planning Committee

The Planning Committee is responsible for Planning and Conservation functions relating to Town and Country Planning and Development Control as specified in Part A (Functions relating to Town and Country Planning and Development Control) of Schedule 1 to The Local Authorities (Functions and Responsibilities) (England) Regulations 2000.

The Planning Committee membership is to be allocated in proportion to the political composition of the Council.

### 2. Licensing and Enforcement Committee

The Licensing Committee is responsible for Licensing and Registration functions as set out in Part B (Functions relating to Licensing and Registration) of Schedule 1 to The Local Authorities (Functions and Responsibilities) (England) Regulations 2000.

The Licensing and Enforcement Committee membership is to be allocated in proportion to the political composition of the Council.

Members appointed to the Licensing and Enforcement Committee shall be obliged to abide by the Probity in Licensing and Enforcement Code of Practice.

#### 3. Audit and Governance Committee

The Audit and Governance Committee membership is to be allocated in proportion to the political composition of the Council. The Committee is responsible for matters relating to probity, ethics and alleged breaches of the Code of Conduct.

#### 4. General Purposes Committee

The General Purposes Committee membership is to be allocated in proportion to the political composition of the Council. The Committee is responsible for matters relating to the Constitution, elections, Quedgeley Town Council, Members' Allowances and employment matters.

#### 5. Senior Appointments Committee

The Senior Appointments Committee membership is to be allocated in proportion to the political composition of the Council. The Committee is responsible for senior appointments and recommending the appointments of statutory officers.

## 6. Appeals Committee

The Appeals Committee membership is to be allocated in proportion to the political composition of the Council. The Committee is responsible for determining appeals against decisions of the Senior Appointments Committee.

#### Note

**Delegation to Officers -** Those functions relating to statutory financial, audit and legal functions which have been delegated to officers are set out in the Council's Scheme of Delegation in Part 3 to this Constitution.
